General infrastructure in the college, and repairs and maintenance of current equipment and facilities is taken care of by way of Annual Maintenance Contracts which covers housekeeping and Computers. Students bring their concerns to the attention of their respective Departments and the Principal through the Students' Council which has a meeting with the IQAC from time to time.
